What is Teach For Malaysia Week?

TFM Week is one of TFM's most significant annual events, where key leaders and influencers from a wide range of fields and backgrounds, including corporate figures, celebrities and members of the civil service, are invited to spend time as "teachers" by co-teaching a lesson in school with a TFM Fellow for half a day.

Why does it matter?

A child's background and circumstances often determines his or her outcome in life. According to the Malaysian Education Blueprint (2013), 1 out of 5 Malaysian children do not finish secondary school. TFM Week has been crucial in raising awareness on the importance of education in building a stronger next generation of Malaysians.

TFM Co-Founder and Managing Director Dzameer shares "For so many of our students, the realities of life get in the way of their ability to dream. The best thing our TFM Week participants can do is to show them that not only can they dream, but that they should dream big dreams. These valuable encounters will help students see that it is entirely possible to do more than dream - that with a good

education, they can actually change their own realities."

Group Chief Executive Officer/ Executive Director of CIMB Group Holdings Berhad, Tengku Dato' Sri Zafrul Tengku Abdul Aziz, said this about his 2018 TFM Week experience: "I think overall it was definitely an enjoyable session for me. I shared with students that it really doesn't matter what your background is. To succeed in the future, make sure you believe in yourself and couple that with a good hard-working ethic."
