


#### Before we start

Children from less privileged communities do not receive the same educational opportunities. The pandemic in 2020 has further exacerbated this gap.

On 24 December 2010. YB Tan Sri Dato Haji Mahiaddin, then Minister of Education launched Teach For Malaysia and the Fellowship programme's first cohort as part of the Tenth Malaysia Plan's initiatives for "Developing and Retaining a First World Talent Base".

The programme aims to equip aspiring Malaysian leaders with on-the-ground skills to create change long-term change in classrooms and communities collectively with our Teach For All global network.

Throughout the two years, we build our Fellows' capacity in pedagogy and leadership through the Fellowship Support Cycle which covers training events and continuous coaching sessions.

We also cultivate a strong sense of community among the Fellows, as this is their closest network before extending it to our wider community of supporters and leaders who are passionate about providing opportunities to students.

## PLC and Cohort Culture

In addition to pedagogical support, we equip our Fellows with problem-solving skills to inspire innovations that are student- and community-centered as there are many similarities between being an educator in the classroom and a leader in the system.

# Student Leadership Camp (SLC)

Students will be equipped with design thinking skills and have the chance to share their projects at school and pitch their ideas to secure funding.

Similar to the Student Leadership Conference (SLC), this opportunity allows Fellows to present their initiatives to prospective investors in order to scale them up for their school or community.


## Come and join us!
