This year's event holds special significance, with the entire 2023 Cohort of TFM Fellows stationed in Sarawak, collaborating closely with local schools and communities in Serian and Padawan to address regional educational challenges under the theme: "Breathing collective solutions into the Education Landscape of Serian and Padawan."



Dragons' Den offers Fellows the opportunity to pitch their ideas to a panel of "Dragons," key players from Sarawak's education, innovation, and corporate sustainability sectors. This year's Dragons include Hajah Siti Aisah Bt. Adenan (Senior Vice President of Corporate Services, Sarawak Energy Berhad), Khairool Adzelan Aman (Ecosystem Development & Digital Innovation Manager, Sarawak Digital Economy Corporation), and Dr Noratikah binti Mohamad Ashari (Deputy Dean, Industry and Community Engagement, UNIMAS), among others.

Inspired by the UK reality show, Dragons' Den allows Fellows to gain valuable feedback, mentorship, and potentially secure funding or in-kind support. Their initiatives aim to bridge educational gaps in underserved communities, drawing on the Fellows' experience from working on the ground in schools.

Examples include ARUS Academy, which focuses on STEM and Maker education, Closing the Gap, and Project ID, both leadership-focused, and Edvolution Enterprise, which supports teacher and district officer training.

Vaisshanavi, one of the Fellows who presented her initiative, shared a reflection on her Dragons' Den experience:

"My pitching experience was both exciting and deeply emotional. When I stood before the Dragons, I wasn't pitching for myself—I was pitching for my students. The initiative is closely tied to the urgent needs of the children in my school.



While this may seem like a small initiative, my vision is much bigger. I dream of a future where every school in Malaysia, primary and secondary, has its own book club. Through these clubs, students can engage with books, develop their skills, and most importantly, find their voices."
