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




Let's take a look at the common issues within our education system.



A large percentage of students from underprivileged backgrounds lack proficiency in reading, writing, and mathematics at the end of Grade 5. (World Bank, 2024)



Malaysia has one of the highest learning losses among Asian developing nations, potentially leading to a lifetime income loss of RM767.5 billion for the 5 million+students in Malaysia. (World Bank, 2021)




58% of 15-year-old Malaysians are unable to meet the minimum proficiency level in reading . (OECD, 2023)

Every child deserves the chance to shape their future and lead a fulfilling life. However, systemic inequities and a child's socioeconomic background often determine their educational outcomes. The pandemic in 2020 has further widened this gap.



What is The Fellowship Programme?





To empower students, we must first empower our changemakers.

At Teach For Malaysia, we believe that quality education is the most powerful tool to help children realise their full potential, and it takes collective leadership to ensure that all children have equitable access to quality education.

On 24 December 2010, YB Tan Sri Dato Haji Mahiaddin, then Minister of Education launched **Teach For Malaysia** as part of the Tenth Malaysia Plan initiatives for "Developing and Retaining a First World Talent Base".

The first cohort of Teach For Malaysia Fellows (Cohort 2012) started teaching in 2012.

We rigorously recruit high potential candidates as TFM Fellows serving in high-need communities and classrooms.



The Fellowship programme can be accessed via two pathways:

Launched in 2022: <u>Teaching Partner Pathway</u>

Fellows are placed as Teaching Partners, who **support existing public school teachers** in Orang Asli and B40 communities. Salary and training costs are borne by TFM.

Launched in 2024:
Guru Muda Pathway

Fellows are existing **in-service MOE teachers** with 0-5 years of service, who have shown strong leadership potential. Fellows remain as public school teachers while in the Fellowship programme.

After completion of the 2 years, Fellows from all pathways will be recognised as TFM Alumni



The Teaching Partner Pathway

As Teaching Partners, Fellows are paired with experienced Ministry of Education teachers - who serve as "Guru Hos" - to co-teach. There are 3 key parts to the Fellowship.

1 Co-teaching



Fellows and Guru Hos implement a co-teaching approach to improve student learning in the classroom.

2 Community Initiative



Fellows plan and implement community projects or extracurricular activities to enhance student engagement and access to opportunities, inside and outside the classroom.


3 Training and Support



Fellows receive rigorous, on-going training and support to develop leadership and pedagogical skills. As part of the training, Fellows pursue Post-Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) or its equivalent.









All it takes to a better education for Malaysia is a network of educators that celebrates itself.



Key Components of the Fellowship











To empower students, we must first empower our changemakers.

Throughout the two years of the Fellowship, we continuously build Fellows' capacity in pedagogy and leadership, beginning with a 7-week Pre-Service Programme (PSP).

Pre-Service Programme

Pre-Service
Programme is an intensive, residential training programme for all Fellows. The training provides
Fellows with the fundamentals of teaching and learning as well as leadership for equity in education.



Kem SKORlah

Kem SKORlah is an intensive school readiness programme, taught by Fellows while completing PSP.

Kem SKORlah serves as an important training ground for Fellows to demonstrate mastery of teaching and learning skills learnt during PSP.





All Fellows receive targeted support from their Leadership Development Officer and the Training & Support team, via workshops and coaching sessions.



Leadership Development Officer

Each Fellow is paired with a Leadership Development Officer (LDO), who provides ongoing, continuous support throughout the 2-year journey. The support consists of classroom visits and coaching sessions, both in leadership and instructional.





We also cultivate a strong cohort culture and community. Fellows also have access to Alumni support.

Collab & Cohort Support

To create a sustainable movement, we actively foster a strong sense of community amongst our Fellows.

TPP Fellows are also placed in pairs or small groups - and serve as Collaborators (or Collabs) within the same school.



Alumni Support

We also invest in building Fellows' relationship with Alumni, especially those serving in the same region. This allows Fellows to unlock additional support and partnerships with our growing Alumni movement.





To strengthen the professional recognition of our Fellows, we provide accredited learning opportunities that enhance their credentials and expertise, equipping them to drive meaningful change in education.

Post-Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCEi)

In line with our commitment to having only qualified Fellows in our classrooms, Fellows earn a teaching qualification (a post-graduate certificate or equivalent) while completing the Fellowship.



Teach For All Resources

Fellows are able to gain access to Teach For All global learning circles, online resources, and knowledge exchange—both virtually and in-person. There are also opportunities to connect with Fellows across 64 partner countries.








Come and join us!
